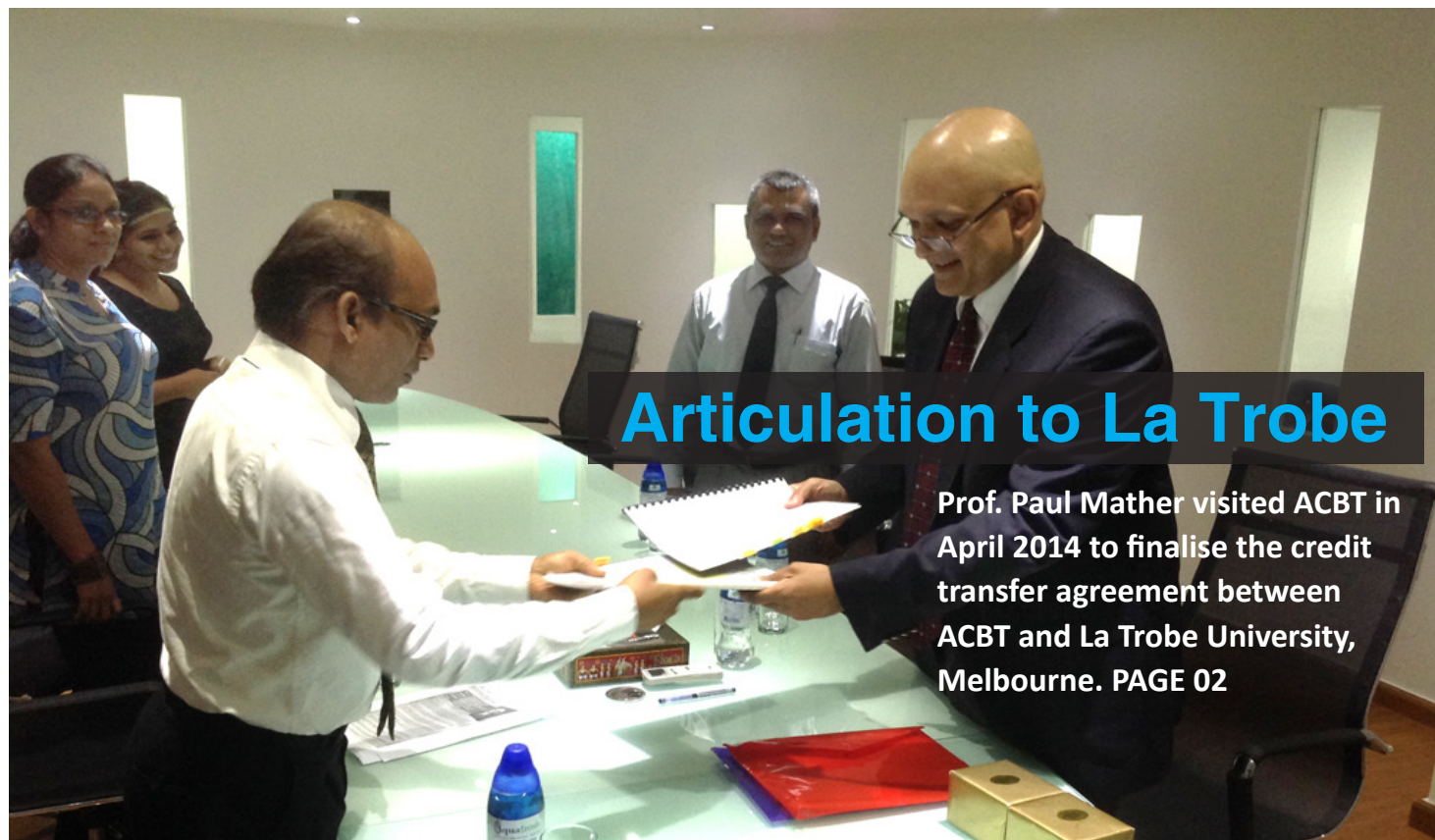
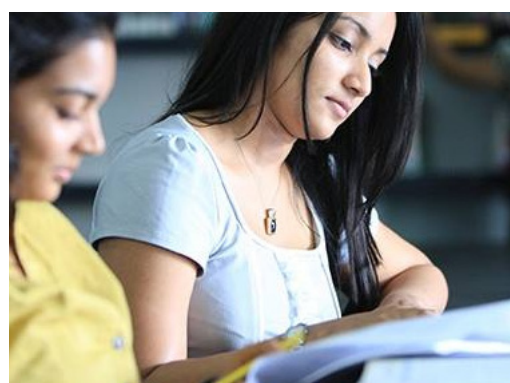

## Library Hours

Monday to Friday from 8.30 am – 7pm

Saturday from 8.30am – 5pm

Sunday from 8.30am – 3pm

## How to get Membership

- Submit your the College ID/ Enrolment receipt at the security point.
- Request for an Application form from the Library Circulation Desk
- Fill it up & Return the completed application form with a photograph to the Circulation Desk
- ID will be prepared by the library staff within a day or two

## Books

Our collection of books contains material to support both current programmes & research.

Books are arranged systematically according to a Classification Scheme. Guidance will be provided to proceed to the required subject or a book/journal.

We have books on all subject areas of Business, Economics, Law, Statistics, English, Marketing, Management, Computers, Science etc.

We hold a number of special collection project reports originated from past students, past papers, article extracts etc. for reference.

## Periodicals/ Journals

The library has a collection of print journals & periodicals for reference. Past issues could be borrowed for 2 weeks.

\*You may borrow 2 books at a time for 2 weeks. These could be renewed for another 2 weeks on request unless they have not been requested by another user. This can be done online or by visiting the library.

Books have to be returned on or before the due date. If not returned on time you will receive an overdue notices.

Books in the reference collection are not to be removed from the library.

## Penalty

The library impose a fine on overdue loans. You are responsible for all items on loan in your ID card & the name. You will be charged at the current replacement cost for lost items.
